We're happy to present the 2015 Annual Report for the Wicker Park Bucktown Special Service Area #33.

Often called "Business Improvement Districts" in other cities, a Special Service Area is a supplemental property tax levy on the properties in the district. It is an economic development tool; the funds generated by the district are used exclusively within the district for beautification and community enhancements. WPB SSA #33 is guided by an award-winning master plan, directed by citizen volunteers who are taxpayers in the district, and administered by the Wicker Park Bucktown Chamber of Commerce.

Some of the extra services provided by the WPB SSA #33 district include tree care, tree planting and pruning, transportation enhancements, holiday decorations, and community grants—ranging from arts programming at Wicker Park Fest and bike-powered stages at Green Music Fest, to public murals and artwork on benches throughout the neighborhood. Additionally, we continued our popular shredding and e-waste recycling events, provided sidewalk cleaning and snow removal and continued to provide supplemental trash pick-up in the district.

By providing these enhanced services, we contribute to the creation of a vibrant, inviting and safer neighborhood for all.

The streets and avenues highlighted to the right with labels and thicker white lines comprise the WPB SSA #33 district.




OUR BUDGET


